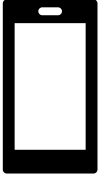


## Office of Compliance and Privacy (OCP) Hotline

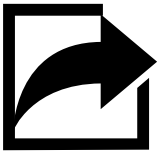
### What happens when you report a concern to the hotline?



Stanford Medicine has a non-retaliation policy protecting people who speak up in good faith. When contacting the hotline to report a concern, you have the option to remain anonymous.



When you call the hotline or file a report online, you will be asked for details about your concern. Calls to the hotline are never recorded. You will receive a report ID number and be prompted to create a password. Keep this information. You will need it to check the status of your report or to provide additional information about your concern. We treat all information as confidential and share only on a need-to-know basis.



After you make your report, OCP is notified that a new concern has been raised. Each report is reviewed and assigned to the appropriate resource for follow-up.



If you wish to check the status of your report use the report ID number you received and the password that you created. If you chose to remain anonymous, this is the only way for us to communicate with each other, share updates, and request additional information, if needed.



OCP will take appropriate action to respect and preserve confidentiality for all individuals involved, we may not be able to share specific details about the investigation or resolution with you, but rest assured, your voice was heard, and it mattered.
